Foundation Information Evening

Next Tuesday, 24th November we will hold our Foundation Information Evening for the parents of our 2021 Foundation children. The meeting will take place via Zoom and we look forward to seeing the families there and sharing important information about the start of the school year. Diocese Of Ballarat Catholic Education Limited (DOBCEL)

On Wednesday November 25th, Fr James will sign the official 'School Transfer Agreement' of our school to DOBCEL. This significant occasion will be marked with a short ceremony and prayer service attended by Tom Sexton (New director of Catholic Education-Ballarat), Tracey O'Neill (Chair of the DOBCEL Board), Fr James, Kate Quin, Jason Perry, our school Captains and Laura Crow our SAC chairperson. The agreement is the transfer of governance from the Parish Priest to DOBCEL, effective 1st January 2021. The transfer is at a governance level (policy, employment, system transparency and accountability) and doesn't impact the day to day running of the school; this work will continue to be delegated to the School Principal. All Catholic Primary Schools in the Ballarat Diocese have, and or will continue transitioning to this new arrangement by the end of the year.

Carols Evening

Due to current restrictions, our 'Carols Evening' has been revamped into a virtual affair! While not quite the same, it is sure to still be a special day for the staff and students. Running on Friday December 4th, all students are encouraged to wear a Christmas themed outfit, we will draw the Christmas hamper raffle winners and some special activities will take place in classrooms throughout the day! Students have begun to prepare 'Carols' which will be uploaded as a video link and made available to families via our Facebook page. Look out for our P & F Christmas hamper flyer that was sent home with the oldest family member today.



Thank you for Your feedback

Thank you to the additional 54 families who responded to the Family engagement Survey last week meaning in total we had **116 parents** share their thoughts. This was a great response and gives a really clear picture of what families value about our current Family Engagement strategies and where they could see we could strengthen our current practices. This data will be used by the Family Engagement team to continue to build on and strengthen our partnership between school and home in 2021. The data clearly showed that many parents would like to help more in classrooms and be asked more frequently for their ideas for the school so these will be good starting points when looking to improve on what we currently do.

In summary: the favourite engagement strategies selected by families to be engaged in the learning were

- Receiving seesaw posts (77%)
- Posts on facebook or Instagram (66%)
- Parent teacher Interviews (various formats) (80%)
- School and class newsletters (74%)
- Meet the teacher Chats (72%)
- Positive emails or phone calls about their child from staff (58%)
- Regular notes in the diary (59%)
- School Assemblies (56%)



Hats, sunscreen and water!

We are moving into some hot weather for the remainder of Term 4. This means it is becoming even more important for the children to make sure they are wearing their hat in the playground. We also strongly encourage the children to apply sunscreen before school and before heading out to play. Each classroom has sunscreen available, or the children can use their own. The last three confidence-building strategies every parent and teacher should know are by Michael Grose who is one of Australia's leading parenting experts.

6. Practise unconditional acceptance

Your ability to accept children and young people's best efforts in any area of endeavour, irrespective of the results, will go a long way toward determining their self-esteem and confidence. If a child makes their bed to the very best of their ability, resist fixing it, even though it may fall short of your adult standards. Instead remind them next time of how to do it well.

7. Expand their horizons

Some kids are confident and capable at home but are fearful and nervous when it comes to new social situations and unfamiliar environments. Children today have less opportunity than those in the past to negotiate and explore unpredictable situations. Wherever possible look for opportunities to expand children's horizons to include unfamiliar places and unfamiliar locations including catching public transport and walking to friends' places unattended when capable.

8. Recognise improvement

Focus your comments on children's effort and improvement rather than on winning the game or getting top marks. Help kids set realistic goals in line with their capabilities and interests. Learning five new spelling words a week may be more realistic than 20 words that his school may require. Most importantly, great parents and teachers have a knack of communicating confidence in kids. They find ways to let kids know that they believe in them – that they know their kids will perform and succeed, that they have faith that they can deal with life's challenges and know that they can become more independent.

2021 Enrolments

With schools returning to normal we have had some prospective families call. If you know of anyone who is considering St Mary's next year could you please let them know that enrolments are open for Foundation and other year levels for 2021 and they are warmly welcome to make contact with the school for further information.



School pick up times and locations?

There are additional staff on duty in the afternoons to ensure that children progressively leave the school over a 15 minute period. Our three bell system at the end of the day will remain in place

- 3.15 First bell dismissal of town bus children and walkers/riders
- 3.20 Second bell dismissal for country bus travellers
- 3.25 Third bell dismissal of remaining children and After School Care bus travellers

As per our previous arrangements when we returned to school, families who are picking up their children by car have been allocated a student collection location-based on family surname.

A to L Families - collection from the front of the school (front carpark)

M to Z Families - collection from outside the gym (gym car park)

Please wait in or by your car and the staff on duty will help your child find you and safely cross them over.

Town Bus Passes

Canteen


Just a reminder that all canteen orders need to be placed through CDFpay, the cut off time for orders is 10am.
