#### St Mary's Family Engagement Survey

We had 62 families complete the survey which gave us a great snapshot of what families value about our current Family Engagement strategies and where they could see we could strengthen our current practices. This data will be used by the Family Engagement team to continue to build on and strengthen our partnership between school and home in 2021. In a nutshell, the favourite engagement strategies selected by families to be engaged in the learning were

- Receiving seesaw posts (77%)
- Posts on facebook or Instagram (66%)
- Parent teacher Interviews (various formats) (80%)
- School and class newsletters (74%)
- Meet the teacher Chats (72%)
- Positive emails or phone calls about their child from staff (58%)



- Regular notes in the diary (59%)
- School Assemblies (56%)

The data also showed that parents would like to help more in classrooms and be asked more frequently for their ideas for the school .

#### **Year 2 Water Safety Program**

The Year 2 students and staff are quite excited to commence their swimming program this week. Conducted at the Swan Hill Leisure Centre, the Water Safety and Skills program forms part of our PE and Health curriculum. The program concentrates on building confidence in water, developing and mastering some basic strokes and teaching safety skills and knowledge around water.

#### Hats, sunscreen and water!

Although the weather is all over the place, we are definitely starting to have some warmer weather! This means it is becoming even more important for the children to make sure they are wearing their hat in the playground. We also strongly encourage the children to apply sunscreen before school and before heading out to play. Each classroom has sunscreen available, or the children can use their own. All students also need to bring a clearly labelled water bottle to school to keep them hydrated as bubblers are dsbaled under current Covid guidelines.

The next three confidence-building strategies every parent and teacher should know are by Michael Grose who is one of Australia's leading parenting experts.

#### 3. Praise strategy


While effort is key for achievement, it's not the only thing. Kids need to try new strategies and seek input from others when they're stuck. They need this repertoire of approaches – not just sheer effort – to learn and improve. It helps too to focus language on better and smarter ways on improving. Comments such as "That was a smart idea to tackle the hardest task while you were fresh!" (strategy) and "You recognised the first few steps were the most important but then after that you were right" are descriptive statements that have significant instructional value for kids.

#### 4. Develop self-help skills from an early age

A child's self-esteem comes as a result of his or her successes and accomplishments. The most important competencies to build confidence are basic self-help skills. These form the building blocks upon which other competencies such as organisational skills and many social skills are formed.

#### 5. Give them real responsibility

From a young age start giving children responsibility for some aspects of their lives. By giving kids responsibility for many aspects of their lives we are sending a powerful message that we think they are capable. Also they are learning the skills necessary to care for themselves.



#### **2021 Enrolments**

With schools returning to normal we have had some prospective families call. If you know of anyone who is considering St Mary's next year could you please let them know that enrolments are open for Foundation and other year levels for 2021 and they are warmly welcome to make contact with the school for further information.



#### School pick up times and locations?

There are additional staff on duty in the afternoons to ensure that children progressively leave the school over a 15 minute period. Our three bell system at the end of the day will remain in place

- 3.15 First bell dismissal of town bus children and walkers
- **3.20** Second bell dismissal for country bus travellers
- 3.25 Third bell dismissal of remaining children and After School Care bus travellers

As per our previous arrangements when we returned to school, families who are picking up their children by car have been allocated a student collection location-based on family surname.

A to L Families - collection from the front of the school (front carpark)

M to Z Families - collection from outside the gym (gym carpark)

<u>Please wait in or by your car and the staff on duty will help your child find you and safely cross them over.</u>
