#### **Easing of COVID-19 Restrictions**

It was wonderful to receive an update that outlined the easing of school restrictions late last week. I have included a summary of the most pertinent information in the Administration section of this newsletter.

#### **Building Announcement**

Exciting times ahead indeed! Last week our local member for Mallee Anne Webster, announced that St Mary's will receive 1.2 million dollars through the schools capital grants program to upgrade our existing infrastructure. This money will allow us to complete the next stage of our master plan. Essentially, our current Year 1 classrooms (Rms C, D, E & F) will be refurbished and incorporated into an 8 classroom contemporary learning space, complete with internal learning streets and toilets. This hub will house 2 junior year levels and will be a fantastic addition to our current school facilities.

#### **Carols Event**

Like many school events throughout Term 4, it has been necessary to revamp our 'Carols Evening' into a virtual affair! While not quite the same, it is sure to still be a special day for the staff and students. Running this Friday December 4th, all students are encouraged to wear a Christmas themed outfit, we will draw the Christmas hamper raffle winners and some special activities will take place in classrooms throughout the day! Thanks to Mrs Dunstan and Mrs Bowd, everyone has been preparing 'Carols' which will be uploaded as a video link and made available to families via our Facebook page. Thank you to the many families that have already sent in items for the P & F Christmas hamper raffle. We are making these up Friday morning so still plenty of time still to get your raffle tickets back or to send in something for a hamper.

#### **Reports**

Our teachers are currently writing their reports for this semester - This semester will again see a report that is different as determined by the VCAA (Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority), the Victorian Department of Education and the CECV (Catholic Education Commission of Victoria). These directions are a result of the extraordinary circumstances during the semester. Reports will be mailed home on Friday, December 11th.

#### **St Mary's Got Talent**

Now that children no longer have to play in zoned areas we can enjoy some of our traditional end of year activities including a firm favourite on the calendar....the St Mary's Got Talent acts! Running for three days (starting Monday 7th December), only this highly anticipated annual event showcases the many gifts and talents amongst our students and provides a great source of entertainment for all at lunchtimes.

#### **2021 Planning Day**

Just a reminder to all families that Thursday, 10th of December is our final school closure day. This time is used by staff to work with their new team and begin preparation of curriculum to be taught in the 2021 year and to complete some PD that was rescheduled due to COVID.

#### **SRC Christmas Casual Dress Fundraiser**

Thanks everyone for your support of our Casual Clothes day, with \$524.10 raised through gold coin donations. The children involved in the SRC will go 'shopping' to purchase Christmas presents for families in need. These gifts are wrapped and labelled according to the gender and age group they are best suited to and placed under the Christmas tree in the church. Along with other gifts donated by parishioners, these are distributed to families prior to Christmas Day. This Friday 4th December is our last casual dress day where children can come dressed in their Christmas themed clothes.

#### **Year 6 Graduation Evening**

Now that restrictions have eased we are delighted we can have an onsite Yr 6 graduation ceremony. This will take place outdoors on Tuesday the 8th December at 6:30pm. It is a lovely time to celebrate all of our Year 6 students contributions to our school and to acknowledge the achievements of our award winner recipients. Please note that due to caps on outdoor gatherings, only Yr 6 students and their parents can attend but we will be videoing the evening and taking lots of photos to be shared with siblings and extended family members.

#### St Mary's Orientation Day 2020 & Year 6 Transition Day

On Friday, 11th December we will hold our Orientation Day when our new Foundation children come to our school and our Year 6's move on to their new school. Orientation Day is the day when all the children move up into their new classroom, meet their new teacher and begin to form relationships with their 2021 classmates. This day runs until 12:30 and provides a great opportunity for your child to familiarise themselves with their new classmates and teacher. At 12:30 our preschoolers go home and all other children return to their 2020 classrooms for the remainder of the day.

On Monday, 15th December we will celebrate our school year. This year the children will attend Mass in their classrooms and the video link shared with all families. This Mass is our way to formally reflect upon and celebrate all we have achieved this year and to say farewell to our Year 6 students and any departing staff. #### **Diocese Of Ballarat Catholic Education Limited (DOBCEL)**

Last Wednesday November 25th, Fr James signed the official 'School Transfer Agreement' of our school to DOBCEL. The agreement is the transfer of governance from the Parish Priest to DOBCEL, effective 1st January 2021. The transfer is at a governance level (policy, employment, system transparency and accountability) and doesn't impact the day to day running of the school; this work will continue to be delegated to the School Principal. All Catholic Primary Schools in the Ballarat Diocese have, and or will continue transitioning to this new arrangement by the end of the year.

# Goodbye primary school, hello secondary school

The end of primary school is a significant milestone in children's lives. They've spent half their lives in primary school, in many cases in the same school, which is significant. Developmentally they've come a long way from those skinny little kids who lined up for class on the first day holding a parent's or carer's hand. Now entering puberty, most are taller than their mothers and the only people they'll hold hands with are 'special friends', but not in public. Those displays of affection will come later in the secondary school years. Changing from primary to secondary brings a mixture of emotions in kids such as excitement, apprehension, pride and, in many cases, sadness about leaving friends and familiar surroundings behind. Parents often go through the same range of emotions as children at this time so we need to acknowledge those feelings in ourselves, just as we should in our children.

## **Looking back**

This is a time for kids to celebrate their achievements; show appreciation to their teachers and enjoy the friendships that they've formed. Here are three ideas:

# 1. Let's celebrate

Primary school graduation ceremonies play an important part in the primary school life, as they mark the end of an era and the start of a new part of their lives. We need to be careful that the meaning doesn't become lost as graduations become increasingly lavish, even to the point where some students are transported to their graduation in a stretch limo. Keep them simple and keep them close to the school's values.

#### 2. Show gratitude

As a former teacher I know how much a simple thank you can mean from students at the end of the year. So make sure your kids take the time to thank their final year teacher and as well as seek out to thank other teachers who contributed to their education over their primary school journey. Gratitude costs nothing but has a great impact.

### 3. Enjoy friendships

Encourage your kids to be open and friendly at this time of the year, and steer clear of cliques and fellow students who want to exclude others from their groups. The end of primary school can be tricky to navigate, particularly when early maturers stick together and ostracise certain classmates. This is the time for friendly behaviour and inclusiveness.

#### **COVID Guidelines Update**

The following provides an overview of the key changes;

- -Drinking fountains and taps should be reopened for normal use
- -Schools can conduct onsite tours for prospective students and their families
- -Schools are no longer required to reduce mixing amongst staff or different year levels
- -Public events on school premises are now permitted-still has limits and many restrictions
- -Liturgies are permitted subject to public gathering limits
- -Kinder to School and Year 7 Transitions can now have groups of up to 20 indoors
- -Orientation events can go ahead subject to adaptation
- -Indoor contact and non-contact sport can resume
- -Interschool activities can now resume
