

Health Reminder

Country Buses

Now that we are getting into the Football/Netball season, just a reminder that Bus Passes will not be given to students for after school activities ie sport, dance, visiting friends. Country buses are to be used for travel between school and home only.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students.

HOW TO APPLY:

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from

www.education.vic.gov.au/Documents/about/programs/health/CSEF-Application-Form-2020.pdf.

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2020, you do not need to complete an application form in 2021 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

- You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:
 new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2020
 - changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2021.

If you are unsure please contact the school office on 50332541. If you are eligible for CSEF you are also eligible for the Family Fee Assistance Scheme. The FFAS amount for 2021 is \$850.00. This amount is credited against your school fee account once your CSEF application has been validated.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

In Term 2, in conjunction with our Parents & Friends Committee, we are hosting a **Colour Explosion School Fun Run** to help us fundraise to create a sensory garden, in what is currently known as Brenda's garden.

When is the Colour Explosion School Fun Run? We will be hosting our Colour Explosion School Fun Run on Friday April 30th, from 12pm – 1pm. Please make sure your child bring a large old WHITE shirt (maybe one of Dad's or Grandad's) to wear during the Fun Run. They will be covered in non-toxic, biodegradable colour powder from head to toe!

Is the powder safe? The non-toxic colour powder is made of high-quality corn starch and permitted food colours, so it's safe for skin and eyes. The powder is gluten free, non-toxic, environmentally friendly and non-flammable.

Options for Asthmatics? If your child has been flagged on PAM as being Asthmatic, they will wear a coloured vest for easy identification on the oval. We will set up a separate running lane when approaching the colour powder stations. They will be diverted around the powder station so they don't receive the powder directly. Teachers will put coloured powder on their hands and press the powder onto their shirts. This way it avoids the powder dust in the air.

How does my child fundraise? Fundraising for our sensory garden is easy – simply follow the instructions outlined in your child's sponsorship booklet. Your child can accept donations online by creating a cybersafe fundraising profile at **myprofilepage.com.au**. You can also collect cash donations with your sponsorship booklet. Please return your donations by Friday May 7th.

Can my child still participate without fundraising? Yes, all children will participate on the day and receive sunglasses and a headband to wear during the event.
